

Quick reference guide to the K-3rd 2017-2018 Discipline level system

This guide depicts brief examples of offenses at each discipline level and the consequences available to administrators. Offenses and disciplinary options are not limited to those provided.

***IMPORTANT NOTE, per the discretion of administration,** that two students committing the same offense on the same campus may have different disciplinary actions based on the overall disciplinary record of the student.

Level 1

These behaviors are handled initially by classroom teacher or attending adult, but are referred to administration if they become chronic

- Excessive talking
- Not following directions
- Inappropriate hallway behavior
- Disrespect to classmates/teacher
- Defiance
- Off task in classroom
- Inappropriate cafeteria behavior
- Inappropriate Activity class behavior
- Unprepared for class
- Inappropriate bathroom behavior
- Inappropriate recess behavior
- Chronic lying

Level 2

These behaviors are handled initially by classroom teacher or attending adult, but are referred to administration the second time the behavior occurs

- Persistent offenses from level 1
- Inappropriate language
- Physically contacting a student creating a disruptive environment (i.e. kicking, pushing in line, hands on another student)
- Repeated dress code violations
- Cheating
- Bullying behaviors
- Harmfully throwing objects at recess

Level 3

These behaviors are immediately referred to administration

- Persistent offenses from level 2
- Fighting
- Vandalism
- Possession of tobacco, alcohol, drugs and drug paraphernalia
- Serious theft
- Possession of weapons, lighters, matches, etc.
- Non-emergency pulling of fire alarm
- Extreme aggression
- Endanger of self or others
- Leaving school without permission

***IMPORTANT NOTE, per the discretion of administration,** that two students committing the same offense on the same campus may have different disciplinary actions based on the overall disciplinary record of the student.

Level 1

These behaviors are handled initially by classroom teacher or attending adult, but are referred to administration if they become chronic

- Inappropriate language
- Repeated classroom disruption
- Inappropriate classroom behavior
- Inappropriate cafeteria behavior (i.e. throwing food, leaving messes)
- Inappropriate public displays of affection
- Writing on desk
- Chronic disrespect to classmates or teacher
- Defiance
- Excessive tardiness to class after 1st bell
- Chronic littering/failure to clean up mess in classroom
- Teasing/name calling of other students
- Inappropriate hallway or bathroom behavior
- Unprepared for class
- Possession of or chewing gum
- No homework
- other

Level 2

These behaviors are handled initially by classroom teacher or attending adult, but are referred to administration the second time the behavior occurs

- 7 previous offenses from level 1
- Abuse of school equipment
- Dress code violation
- Inappropriate representation of school (i.e. field trips, sports, etc.)
- Forgery
- Repeated inappropriate language
- Cheating (assignments, tests, essays etc.)
- Theft
- Inappropriate displays of affection
- Lying
- Violation of computer use policy
- Disrespecting teachers/adults
- Possession of electronic devices
- Physical aggression
- Defacing school property
- Other

Level 3

These behaviors are immediately referred to administration

- 3 previous offenses from level 2
- Skipping class
- Cell phone violation
- Vandalism/destruction of school property
- Use/possession of drugs/drug paraphernalia
- Fighting
- Possession of weapons
- Extreme physical aggression toward classmate or employee
- Threat of violence or harm to self or others
- Bullying
- Non-emergency pulling of fire alarm
- Leaving school grounds without permission

Administrative consequence options for level offenses

**Possible referral to School Counselor may accompany disciplinary action*

- Recovery time
- Isolated lunch
- Confiscation of item
- Exclusion from extracurricular activities
- Restitution of damages/restoring to order
- Parent call or conference
- Correct dress code violation
- Behavior conference/Verbal reprimand
- Redo of work away from students (for cheating only)
- ½ day in in-school suspension
- Full day/days in in-school suspension
- Out-of-school suspension\
- Corporal punishment
- Other
